PARISH NEWS

CHURCH OPENING - UPDATE

We are very grateful to Frs Ignatius and Joseph from Our Lady Immaculate, Tolworth, who were with us for a few days whilst Fr Uche was isolating. Unfortunately there was a positive covid case at 5.30 Mass last Sunday 7th Feb, so we had to take measures which included identifying those who may have been close enough or had any interaction with the infected person, and asking them to isolate. This also resulted in us having to close the church for the week until Fr Uche finished his isolating following his return, and could resume his public ministry, which is from this Sunday.

We have been very blessed that this is the first time this has happened in our church, and this is only due to the diligence and care taken by everyone involved in the continued smooth and safe running of Mass at St Joseph's during this pandemic, not least of which our faithful stewards and Extra-Ordinary Ministers.

At this point, we feel we need to stress again the importance of wearing protective face-covering, thorough hand-sanitising and the maintaining of distance from others.

IF YOU - OR ANYONE YOU HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH / LIVE WITH - ARE WAITING FOR THE RESULT OF A COVID TEST OR ARE EXPERIENCING COLD OR FLU SYMPTOMS, PLEASE DO NOT COME TO CHURCH UNTIL YOU ARE AS SURE AS POSSIBLE YOU ARE NOT INFECTED. This way we can continue to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all at church and the wider community, as much as is humanly possible.

We continue to review our counter measures against the Covid19 Pandemic and the availability of stewards weekly, and we can report that at this point, we are able to safely open our church to the public for all weekend Masses and all 10am weekday Masses, apart from Mondays, Fridays & now Saturdays, when Mass will be live-streamed only.

NB. There is no 5.30 Mass this Sunday 14th February only.

ROSARY PRAYER CAMPAIGN TO CONQUER THE VIRUS

In our Catholic history and tradition Our Blessed Lady has many titles. One is "Health of the Sick." We would like to ask you to consider doing something in our desperate situation today. We would suggest that you pray the Rosary every day, preferably with the whole family. It takes not much longer than 20 minutes. Out of 24 hours of the day can we begrudge God 20 minutes?

One suggestion is to do it after supper on one's knees (if those hinges still work!). The Rosary has 5 decades, each child could lead one with parents taking turns. One possibility would be to offer the 1st decade for those who are sick; the 2nd decade for doctors and nurses; the 3rd decade for scientific research to control and halt the virus; the 4th decade for world leaders and pharmaceutical agencies not to be motivated by profit, control or ideology. Finally, the last decade could be offered for family and local intentions.

Our Blessed Lord tells us that if we want to enter into salvation we have to become like a little child. Furthermore, the prayer of children has always been deemed powerful. Let us therefore not allow discouragement and anxiety to dominate us but instead to trust in God and Our blessed Lady that Grace will deliver us if we but pray!

POPE FRANCIS DECLARES YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled Patris Corde ('With a Father's Heart'), Pope Francis has proclaimed a special 'Year of St Joseph' which began on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extends to the feast in 2021. The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father wrote 'Patris Corde' against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the



man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation." FROM OUR DIOCESAN SAFEGUARDING OFFICE - The government have launched the "**Ask for ANI**" codeword scheme in partnership with Boots and independent pharmacies across the country. Those who are victim to or at risk of domestic abuse can ask for ANI and a safe space will be provided, by a trained pharmacist, to allow the individual to access support services and helplines. Where the victim is at risk of harm, the police and other relevant authorities may be contacted.

This scheme is especially useful in helping those who are isolated at home with their abuser and unable to access help.

Think you need to go to A&E? Think NHS 111 First

If you need urgent, but not life-threatening care, call NHS 111 before turning up to an emergency department. If,

following a conversation with NHS 111, it is appropriate for you to attend the emergency department you may be scheduled a time to attend. Thinking NHS 111 First will also help you get to the most appropriate service when you may not have to attend the emergency department. This could include self-care or a slot at your GP practice, a GP hub or a nearby Urgent Treatment Centre. You can still go to ED and UTC without calling ahead but thinking "NHS 111 First" will mean:



- shorter waiting times via a booked slot at the emergency department or another appropriate service ;
- safe social distancing away from busy emergency department waiting rooms to protect you and others from COVID-19.

Respond to Department of Health consultation to stop home abortions!

The Department of Health is holding a public consultation on whether to continue the practice of allowing abortion providers to send abortion pills to women so that they can perform their own abortion at home. We need as many prolife people as possible to complete the Department of Health's questionnaire in order to help stop dangerous DIY abortions becoming permanent. From our Diocesan Safeguarding Office - Reporting abuse

If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger. It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are in any role within the Catholic Church in England and Wales, you must refer allegations directly to the safeguarding office for your diocese or religious congregation, or directly to the Police If you are a member of the public, please refer allegations directly to the police and also to the safeguarding office in your diocese.
