ST PETER & ST PAUL, APOSTLES





Today we celebrate the feast of the two great Apostles, Peter and Paul (*trans from the 29th*). Their veneration has its roots in the very foundations of the Church. They are the solid rock on which the Church is built. They are at the origin of her faith and will forever remain her protectors and her guides. To them Rome owes her true greatness, for it was under God's providential guidance that they were led to make the capital of the Empire, sanctified by their martyrdom, the centre of the Christian world from where should radiate the preaching of the Gospel.

St Peter suffered martyrdom under Nero, in A.D. 66 or 67. After being crucified upside-down, he was buried on the hill of the Vatican where recent excavations have revealed his tomb on the very site of the Basilica of St Peter's. **St Paul** was beheaded in the Via Ostia on the spot where now stands the basilica bearing his name. Down the centuries Christian people in their thousands have gone on pilgrimage to the tombs of these Apostles.

Grant, we pray, O Lord our God, that we may be sustained by the intercession of the blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, that, as through them you gave your Church the foundations of her heavenly office, so through them you may help her to eternal salvation. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

RE-OPENING OF ST JOSEPH'S CHURCH for MASS

As the government guidelines have now changed, allowing for services in church to take place, instead of opening for private prayer on Wednesday 1st July as previously planned, we will be open for Mass from Saturday 4th July, starting with the 10am Mass. The times of Masses will be as in normal time, **apart from the weekday 7am Mass**, **which is suspended until further notice.** Mass will be kept simple, and there can be no singing. Fr Uche or someone else may give you some instructions during Mass re Holy Communion etc - please follow them.

As numbers will be limited, for social distancing reasons, there will be a booking system, details to follow. Watch out for announcements on our live-streams, website and facebook page - there may also be last minute changes, depending on availability of stewards / cleaners. For your safety, and that of others, please see key instructions below:

- 1. The wearing of a face mask/ face covering is compulsory
- 2. Please sanitise your hands well on entering & exiting hand-sanitiser provided
- 3. At all times follow the directions of the stewards and the signs in church
- 4. If you feel unwell, please don't put others in danger and stay at home
- 5. Please be prompt to leave when Mass is finished, to allow time for cleaning, but be guided by the stewards

PROCEDURES during NORMAL TIMES

FOR APPOINTMENTS & enquiries, please contact the Parish Office <u>only during office hours</u> - see bottom of front page - unless it's an urgent matter. Any items for the **BULLETIN** need to be received by Tuesday at the very latest. Thank you.

WEDDINGS: Please make sure you give us at least 6 months' notice when applying to get married in a Catholic Church.

BAPTISMS: Usually these take place on the 1st Saturday of the month, but other dates can be agreed should there be the need. Please ring the Parish Office for enquiries.

REQUESTING A MASS INTENTION: If you know the date you would like a Mass Intention for, please request it as far ahead as possible, and we will endeavour to accommodate the date asked for. If an urgent need for prayer arises, we will do our best to shift an existing Intention, with the agreement of the donor of course.

MASS INTENTIONS & SHRINE LAMP INTENTIONS: envelopes are available at the back of church. Please return via the Presbytery letter box or hand to one of the clergy.

Reporting abuse

If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger.

It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased.

If you are in any role within the Catholic Church in England and Wales, you must refer allegations directly to the safeguarding office for your diocese or religious congregation, or directly to the Police.
