SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT 2022

Today's readings show us how God is truly present in our world. The first reading tells of Abram's encounter with God and the covenant which was made. The psalm declares "Your presence, O Lord, I seek. Hide not your face from me." The second reading reminds us that God has the power to transform us. And the Gospel tells of when Jesus took Peter, James, and John up the mountain and they witnessed his transfiguration. *(Excerpt from young-catholics.com)* Let us all, by our words and actions, during this Lent, be a witness to God's presence in our daily life and interaction with others.

The two very worthy charities we will be supporting this year are:

The Jesuit Refugee Service (Home Charity), an international Catholic organisation, at work in over 50 countries around the world with a mission to ACCOMPANY, SERVE and ADVOCATE on behalf of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons;

The Cornelian Maternity & Rural Health Care Facility located at Gidan Mangoro in the outskirts of Abuja, Nigeria (Overseas Charity). This clinic is administered by the Holy Child Sisters under the leadership of Sr Magdalene Nwaenyi. It provides primary health care to rural women and children who would be otherwise unable to access medical care.

We are still hoping to be able to hold a Charity Fayre this year - more details to come, and it may be that it won't happen until after Easter. SPECIAL FEASTS THIS WEEK

This week we celebrate the feast day of 2 big names in the Catholic Church - **St Patrick**, Patron of Ireland, on Thursday 17th March; and our very own Patron, our dear **St Joseph**, on Saturday 19th March.

ST PATRICK, was born in Roman Britain around the end of the 4th century, and died in Ireland about the middle of the 5th century. As a missionary bishop, he endured many hardships and faced opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Nevertheless, he worked hard to conciliate, to evangelise, and to educate local chieftains and their families. He is remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the gospel to the very people who had enslaved him in his youth. (*Universalis*)

He is the Patron Saint of Ireland and his feast day is celebrated there and in the wider Catholic world.

Not much more is known of **ST JOSEPH** other than what is said of him in the Gospels. He was a carpenter; he accepted the will of God; and he supported Mary and brought up Jesus. From the human character of his son we can see that he was a good and responsible father. He is widely venerated as a patron of artisans who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, and of workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration. (*Universalis*)

St Joseph, Patron of our Parish, may we always be guided by the example of your humble character, ever trusting in God's will.
