#### THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT IS LAETARE SUNDAY

The word "laetare" means rejoice in Latin, and this idea is reflected in the entrance-antiphon for the Mass, which starts "Rejoice, O Jerusalem...". Falling roughly at the half-way point in the Lenten season, this is a Sunday when traditional Lenten austerity is relaxed, and we have a reminder of the joyous resurrection to come.



The day's liturgical colour is rose, instead of the usual purple of the Lenten season. In today's Gospel from John, Nicodemus acknowledged Jesus as someone who had come from God and seemed to want to be a follower of Jesus. Jesus greeted Nicodemus with the observation that one must be born from above to see the Kingdom of God. The dialogue between Jesus and Nicodemus that followed was about the meaning of this phrase. Although Nicodemus seemed to misunderstand Jesus at every point, there was no conscious animosity in the questions he posed to Jesus.

Today's Gospel continues with a theological reflection on Jesus' words to Nicodemus, where John elaborates on a number of themes found in his Gospel light and darkness, belief and unbelief, good and evil, salvation and condemnation. In John's reflection, we find an observation about human sinfulness. We wish to keep our sins hidden, even from God, but Jesus has come into the world to reveal our sins so that they may be forgiven. This is the Good News; it is the reason for our rejoicing in this season of Lent and throughout our lives.



Today we also celebrate a very special day where we remember and pray for Mothers, Grandmothers and all women. The past year has been an especially challenging one for all mothers and women looking after their children and especially home-schooling them. We thank God for their strength & perseverance and pray for his blessing on them all and for a brighter year ahead.


#### FEAST OF ST JOSEPH, PATRON SAINT OF OUR PARISH

#### This Friday, 19th March is the Feast of St Joseph, our dear Patron.

Although St Joseph is undoubtedly one of the most beloved and revered Saints, not much is known of him except what is said in the Gospels. He was a carpenter; he accepted the will of God unconditionally; and he supported Mary and brought up Jesus lovingly and faithfully. Although he was given a truly unique mission he accepted his role with humility, and carried it out with courage and integrity. From the human character of his son we can clearly see that he was a good and responsible father. He is widely venerated as a patron of artisans who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, and of workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration.

#### POPE FRANCIS DECLARES YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled Patris Corde ('With a Father's Heart'), Pope Francis has proclaimed a special 'Year of St Joseph' which began on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extends to the feast in 2021. The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father wrote 'Patris Corde' against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the




man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation." #### ST PATRICK, PATRON OF IRELAND - WEDNESDAY 17TH MARCH

This week we also celebrate another Saint who is very dear to many - St Patrick, Patron of Ireland, on the 17th March, the supposed date of his death. It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday. In the dioceses of Ireland, it is both a solemnity and a holy day of obligation; it is also a celebration of Ireland itself.

St Patrick was born in Roman Britain around the end of the 4th century, and died in Ireland about the middle of the 5th century. As a missionary bishop, he endured many hardships and faced opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Nevertheless, he worked hard to conciliate, to



evangelise, and to educate local chieftains and their families. He is remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, for his humble trust in God, and for his fearless preaching of the gospel to the very people who had enslaved him in his youth. *St Patrick, Pray for us.*
