TODAY IS WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR PEACE

In his message for World Peace Day, Pope Francis asks, "What did we learn from the pandemic? What new paths should we follow to cast off the shackles of our old habits, to be better prepared, to dare new things? What signs of life and hope can we see, to help us move forward and try to make our world a better place?" He continues: "certainly after directly experiencing the fragility of our own lives ... the greatest lesson we learned from COVID-19 was the realisation that we all need one another. That our greatest and yet most fragile treasure is our shared humanity as brothers and sisters, children of God. And that none of us can be saved alone."

He then reflects on the war in Ukraine and comments on how just as we were coming out of the worst of the Covid-19 pandemic, humanity was struck by a terrible new disaster and notes that "While a vaccine has been found for Covid-19, suitable solutions have not yet been found for the war. Certainly, the virus of war is more difficult to overcome than the viruses that compromise our bodies, because it comes, not from outside of us, but from within the human heart corrupted by sin".

He asks us to turn in prayer to Mary Immaculate, Mother of Jesus and Queen of Peace for her intercession, in order to transform our hearts and to open minds and hearts to universal human fraternity.
