TODAY is **Day for Life** - celebrated on the third Sunday of June each year, by the three Bishops' Conferences of England & Wales, Scotland & Ireland. The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. The theme - *Hope does not Disappoint: Finding meaning in Suffering* - is inspired by Romans 5:5-6. St Paul invites us to see that Christian hope is not just naïve optimism but, rather, an unshakeable trust in the power and presence of God who



is with us always. This hope can endure the darkness of human suffering and even see beyond it.

Suffering touches every person at some point in their lives, often associated with illness, grief, and loss. It is not only caused by physical pain but includes emotional suffering as well as 'soul pain', such as depression and despair. Oppose Assisted Suicide

Legislation is passing through parliament seeking to legalise assisted suicide. Terminally Ill Adults (End of Life) Bill, which seeks to legalise assisted suicide, is fast approaching its decisive vote in the House of Commons which will likely take place on the 20th of June.

Raymond Friel, CEO of the Caritas Social Action Network (CSAN), has written an open letter to Members of Parliament to urge them to vote against a Private Member's Bill that seeks to legalise assisted suicide.

His organisation's network includes Catholic charities, care homes, hospices, and community groups that accompany people facing the end of life.

"I believe this Bill represents a serious threat to the dignity of those we serve and to the moral foundations of compassionate care in our society," said Mr Friel. "Our Catholic vision of care is rooted in the belief that every person possesses inherent dignity from birth to natural death. This is the foundation of hospice and palliative care: to relieve pain, offer emotional and spiritual support, and accompany the dying in their final moments, not to end life." Threat of Abortion Decriminalisation

Pro-abortion MPs are trying to hijack the Government's Crime & Policing Bill by tabling two amendments seeking to decriminalise abortion. If either of these amendments were passed, it would be the most massive expansion of abortion since 1967, effectively permitting abortion for any reason up until birth. This Bill is being debated on Tues 17th June and Wed 18th June. Please contact your MP urgently, asking him/her to oppose and, if necessary, vote against New Clauses 1 & 20 of the Crime & Policing Bill. See more on page 4. Additionally - The Bishops' Conference Lead for Life Issues for the, Archbishop John Sherrington, is asking Catholics to contact their MPs to encourage them to oppose two amendments on abortion in the Crime & Policing Bill:

"We are deeply alarmed by two amendments that have been submitted to the Crime and Policing Bill. These would further reduce the protection of unborn children and their mothers. Out of compassion for pregnant women and their babies, the Catholic Church believes that the law should offer protection to the unborn and that society should offer support for parents who need it. The proposed amendments would take our law further in the wrong direction."
