SAINTS CELEBRATED THIS WEEK

Monday 21st June - Memorial of St Aloysius Gonzaga (1568 - 1591). St Aloysius was the eldest son of a Mantuan nobleman, and was intended by his father to be a soldier. Aloysius, on the other hand, had determined to be a missionary, and even to die for his faith. He renounced his birthright in favour of his brother and at the age of 16 became a Jesuit novice in Rome, living the same life of severe austerity and penance that he had followed even when serving in the courts of dukes and princes. In 1591 an epidemic of plague broke out in Rome, and the Jesuits opened a hospital to care for the sick. Aloysius, still a novice, worked hard in the hospital until he himself caught the plague. He did not recover; but, his determination to die for the faith having been fulfilled, died at midnight on the 20th of June with the name of Jesus on his lips. He was just 23 years of age.

Tuesday 22nd June - SS John Fisher (1469 -1535) & St Thomas More (1677 - 1535. John Fisher was bishop, and later in 1535, a Cardinal; Thomas More an eminent lawyer and Lord Chancellor - the highest legal position in England - in 1529, during the reign of King Henry VIII. Both were executed for committing high treason against the king by refusing to denounce the Pope and accept Henry as supreme Head of the Church in England. Both men were loyal to their faith and their beliefs, even when it meant going against their peers and losing their popularity and favours from their king, knowing full well that it would very probably end in their death. John Fisher was the only bishop to oppose Henry's actions, but instead of judging his fellow bishops, said: *I condemn no other man's conscience: their conscience may save them, and mine must save me.* At his execution, Thomas More told the spectators that he was still: *the king's good servant - but God's first.* May we all, in a little way, have the courage to stand up for our faith, like these great men did. St John Fisher & St Thomas More, Pray for us.

THURSDAY 24th June is the FEAST OF the NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST



The Church usually observes the day of a saint's death as his feast, because that day marks his entrance into heaven. There are two notable exceptions, the birthdays of Blessed Mary and of St John the Baptist - all other humans were stained with original sin at birth. But Mary, already in the first moment of her existence, was free from original sin (for which reason even her very conception is commemorated by a special feast), and John was cleansed of original sin in the womb of his mother. This is the dogmatic justification for today's feast. John was the one chosen to announce the coming of Our Lord, preparing the world for Him, therefore his date of birth is sacred. *Grant, we pray, almighty God, that your family may walk in the way of salvation and, attentive to what Saint John the Precursor urged, may come safely to the One he foretold, our Lord Jesus Christ, Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.*
