SAINTS CELEBRATED THIS WEEK



On Monday 3rd May we celebrate the Feast of two of the 12 Apostles, St Philip and St James.

Philip, who was from Bethsaida, was one of Christ's first Apostles, called soon after Jesus' Baptism in the River Jordan, when Jesus asked him to follow him, which Philip did without hesitation. He, in turn recruited Nathaniel, saying that they had found the one of whom Moses and the Prophets wrote. Philip was the one who prompted the feeding of the 5000, and was present at the Wedding of Cana, the Last Supper & Pentecost. St Philip is the Patron Saint of Luxembourg, Uruguay, hatters & pastry-makers!

St James the Lesser was from Cana and the brother of the Apostle Jude, and he wrote one of the Epistles in the New Testament - a devout, edifying yet practical letter. James was thrown down from a temple terrace and clubbed to death when he refused to deny the Divinity of Christ. He was declared a Martyr in the year 62.

O God, who gladden us each year with the feast day of the Apostles Philip and James, grant us, through their prayers, a share in the Passion and Resurrection of your Only Begotten Son, so that we may merit to behold you for eternity. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

Tuesday 4th May is the Feast of the English Martys

On 4 May 1535, at Tyburn in London, three Carthusian monks died, the first of many martyrs of the English Reformation. Of these martyrs, forty-two have been canonised, and a further 242 have been declared Blessed; but the true number of those who died on the scaffold, perished in prison, or were tortured or persecuted for their faith cannot now be reckoned. The persecution lasted a hundred and fifty years and left a permanent mark on English culture.

The martyrs celebrated today came from every walk of life. There were rich and poor; married and single; men and women. They are remembered for the example they gave of constancy in their faith and courage in the face of persecution.

From 2001, there are also celebrated on this day the forty martyrs of England and Wales who were canonised on 25 October 1970 and formerly celebrated on that day. They include Saints Cuthbert Mayne, John Houghton, Edmund Campion, and Richard Gwynn, as well as Saints John Roberts and Ambrose Barlow from the Benedictine monastery of St Gregory at Douay (now at Downside Abbey in Somerset). POPE FRANCIS DECLARES YEAR OF ST JOSEPH

In a new Apostolic Letter entitled Patris Corde ('With a Father's Heart'), Pope Francis has proclaimed a special 'Year of St Joseph' which began on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extends to the feast in 2021. The Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father wrote 'Patris Corde' against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who,



though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."
