FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT THE START OF PASSIONTIDE

The readings for the 5th Sunday of Lent for Year C remind us God sees us in our weakness and suffering and saves us. The first reading tells us to look at the past and see that a new way is possible: *"No need to recall the past, no need to think about what was done before. See, I am doing a new deed!"* The psalm tells of sorrow turning to joy: *"What marvels the Lord worked for us, indeed we were glad!"*. In the second reading Paul explains that we must let go of what we valued to pursue life in Christ: *"For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him."* And in the gospel Jesus confronts the crowd who are about to stone the woman caught in adultery: *"If there is one of you who has not sinned, let him be the first to throw a stone at her!"*.

Let us all then be assured of God's infinite mercy, which surpasses our human inclination to judge others. With that in mind, we can move forward from our past sins towards the pure bright light and happiness that can only be found by living the life God planned for us, always aware that we are all in need of mercy and forgiveness.

PASSIONTIDE

In the liturgical year of the Church, **Passion Sunday** is the fifth Sunday of Lent, marking the beginning of the two-week period called Passiontide. This period is a Christian echo of the Jewish fourteen-day preparation for the Passover. Although short,



it is a season in its own right, and older in its observance than Lent. We veil all the images to give the church a more sombre air, and because even the angels and saints hide their faces, as it were, from what is soon to take place. But we veil crucifixes also in reference to Our Lord's response when the Pharisees' tried to stone him: *"And Jesus hid himself, and went out of the Temple,"* (Jn 8:58). At the Incarnation, the Word of God veiled his Divinity; now, in his sufferings, he appears before us *"marred... beyond human semblance,"* (Is. 52:14). It is as if, in his Passion, he veils even his humanity. Moreover, just as on the Cross he *"thirsts to be thirsted for,"* so we, too, begin to thirst for the sight of his holy countenance, being denied it for so long, as we look forward to our deliverance at Easter.

LENT 2022

The two very worthy charities we will be supporting this year are:

The Jesuit Refugee Service (Home Charity), an international Catholic organisation, at work in over 50 countries around the world with a mission to ACCOMPANY, SERVE and ADVOCATE on behalf of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons.

The Cornelian Maternity & Rural Health Care Facility located at Gidan Mangoro in the outskirts of Abuja, Nigeria (Overseas Charity). This clinic is administered by the Holy Child Sisters under the leadership of Sr Magdalene Nwaenyi. It provides primary health care to rural women and children who would be otherwise unable to access medical care.
