LONDON OVERGROUND TRAIN LINES TO BE GIVEN NAMES

The six overground train lines which run across London are to be given names. One of them will be named Windrush in honour of those people who came to the UK from the Caribbean on the ship HMS Windrush, many of whom worked for London Transport on trains and busses and are recognised as 'part of the fabric of TfL'. The other lines will be called Mildmay (charitable NHS Hospital); Weaver (London's textile industry); Suffragette (Women's equality); and Liberty (freedom and independence).

LIBRARY NAMED AFTER FIRST BLACK BBC RADIO PRODUCER

A library named after a poet, playwright and the BBC's first black radio producer has opened in south London. The Una Marson Library was opened by Southwark Council as part of the redevelopment of the Aylesbury area - once home to one of Europe's biggest housing estates. Councillor Kieron Williams, the council leader, said it was "absolutely fitting" to name the library after Ms Marson who was an "inspiration to thousands". She arrived from Jamaica to the UK in 1932, first staying in Peckham with Black activist Dr Harold Moody. Ms Marson was already an experienced writer and journalist by the time she joined the BBC in 1939.


