## **Reporting Abuse**

If you are concerned about the welfare of a child or adult at risk, do not delay in contacting the police, using 999 if a child or adult is believed to be in immediate danger. It is the policy of the Catholic Church in England and Wales to report all allegations of abuse to statutory authorities, regardless of whether the abuse occurred recently or in the past, or whether the accused person is living or deceased. If you are in any role within the Catholic Church in England and Wales, you must refer allegations directly to the safeguarding office for your diocese or religious congregation, or directly to the Police.

#### **Volunteers and Parishioners**

Everyone who volunteers or works with children and/or vulnerable adults is required to complete safer recruitment, which includes a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check before they can start in their roles. Parish group leaders must refer new volunteers to the Parish Safeguarding Team, who then facilitate safer recruitment. All volunteers are also requested to complete an online safeguarding training module.

However, safeguarding is not just the responsibility of those who work or volunteer within the parish but is something we are all called to do.
