EXTRACT FROM DECREE BY ARCHBISHOP JOHN WILSON



SPES NON CONFUNDIT. "**Hope does not disappoint**" (Rom 5:5). In the spirit of hope, the Apostle Paul addressed these words of encouragement to the Christian community of Rome. Hope is also the central message of the coming Jubilee that, in accordance with an ancient tradition, the Pope proclaims every twenty-five years. In the Bull announcing the Ordinary Jubilee of 2025, at a moment in history in which "heedless of the horrors of the past, humanity is confronting yet another ordeal, as many peoples are prey to brutality and violence" (Spes non confundit, 8), the Holy Father calls on all Christians to become pilgrims of hope. This is a virtue which must be sourced above all in the grace of God and in the fullness of His mercy. It is to be rediscovered in the signs of the times, which, encompassing "the yearning of human hearts in need of God's saving presence, ought to become signs of hope" (Spes non confundit, 7).

In order for the faithful to obtain the Jubilee Year Indulgence, I hereby decree that The Church of St. Ann, KINGSTON HILL is designated as a Jubilee Church in this Archdiocese of Southwark for the duration of the Jubilee Year - 24th December 2024 to 6th January 2026.

The Indulgence may be obtained by the faithful, who are truly repentant and free from any affection for sin (cf. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, IV ed., norm. 20, § 1), who are moved by a spirit of charity and who, during the Holy Year, purified through the sacrament of penance and refreshed by Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff, will be able to obtain from the treasury of the Church a plenary indulgence, with remission and forgiveness of all their sins, which can be applied in suffrage to the souls in Purgatory in the following ways...

Detailed Explanation of the Jubilee Year

Introduction to the Jubilee Year

The Jubilee Year is a special time of grace, renewal, and reconciliation in the Catholic Church. Traditionally celebrated every 25 years, it offers the faithful an opportunity to grow spiritually, deepen their faith, and experience God's mercy in a profound way.

The concept of the Jubilee Year has its roots in the Old Testament. In the Book of Leviticus (25:8-13), God commanded the Israelites to celebrate a Jubilee every 50 years, a time when debts were forgiven, slaves were freed, and land was returned to its original owners. This biblical tradition emphasised liberation, restoration, and rest.

The Catholic Church adopted this practice, with the first Christian Jubilee declared by Pope Boniface VIII in the year 1300. Since then, ordinary Jubilees have been celebrated every 25 years, while extraordinary Jubilees are declared for special occasions, such as the Year of Mercy in 2015.

Purpose of the Jubilee Year

The Jubilee Year is a sacred time to:

- Renew one's relationship with God through prayer, pilgrimage, and acts of mercy.
- Experience God's mercy by seeking forgiveness and extending it to others.
- Grow in hope by trusting in God's promises, even in difficult times.
- Strengthen community bonds by participating in communal worship and activities.

Theme & Logo of the Jubilee Year 2025

Theme of the Jubilee Year 2025: Pilgrims of Hope

Pope Francis has declared the theme for the Jubilee Year 2025 as “Pilgrims of Hope”, inspired by the words of St Paul in his letter to the Romans: “Hope does not disappoint” (Romans 5:5). This theme calls on all Catholics to embark on a spiritual journey, trusting in God’s mercy and love.

Hope is a central virtue in Christian life. It sustains us during trials, helps us remain faithful to God’s promises, and inspires us to work for a better world. The Jubilee invites us to become pilgrims, both physically and spiritually, journeying towards a deeper relationship with Christ.



The Jubilee Logo: Pilgrims in Hope

The Jubilee Year 2025 logo symbolises the theme “Pilgrims of Hope”. It depicts four stylized figures representing humanity coming together in solidarity and fraternity. The lead figure holds onto the Cross, symbolising faith and hope, even amidst life’s challenges.



The rough waves beneath them represent life’s turbulent journey, while the anchor-shaped base of the Cross symbolises stability during storms, echoing the maritime symbol of the “anchor of hope.” The dynamic positioning of the Cross, bending towards humanity, reminds us that Christ offers His constant presence and support. At the bottom, the motto “Pilgrims in Hope” in green reflects hope, creation, and renewal, inviting us to journey together in faith and unity.

Key Elements of the Jubilee Year

Pilgrimage: Pilgrimage is a significant aspect of the Jubilee Year. It symbolises a journey of faith, where the pilgrim leaves behind their ordinary life to seek a closer encounter with God. During the Jubilee Year, special pilgrimage sites are designated, including St Ann's Catholic Church, Kingston Hill, which has been recognised as a sacred place. By visiting these sites, participating in sacred activities, pilgrims can gain spiritual benefits.

St Ann's holds deep spiritual significance, with St Ann, the mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary, as its patron. She stands as a beacon of hope for families, expectant mothers, and future generations. Our proximity to Richmond Park offers pilgrims a unique opportunity for reflection amidst nature, aligning perfectly with Pope Francis' emphasis on care for creation.

Plenary Indulgence: A central feature of the Jubilee Year is the opportunity to receive a Plenary (full) Indulgence, which is the complete remission of temporal punishment due to sin. Although the guilt of sin is forgiven through Baptism and Confession, its temporal consequences remain, necessitating purification either in this life or in Purgatory. Through God's mercy and the Communion of Saints, the Church, drawing on its treasury of spiritual goods - Christ's merits and the prayers of the saints - dispenses indulgences. To gain a Plenary Indulgence, the faithful must meet four conditions: sacramental confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, and complete detachment from all sin, even venial sin. This gift strengthens our spiritual journey, calling us to seek holiness, reconciliation, and deeper union with God and His Church.

Summary of conditions for receiving a Plenary Indulgence:

- Be free from all attachment to sin.
- Sacramentally confess one's sins.
- Receive Holy Communion.
- Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
- Perform a sacred act, such as passing through the Holy Door, attending Mass, or participating in Eucharistic Adoration.



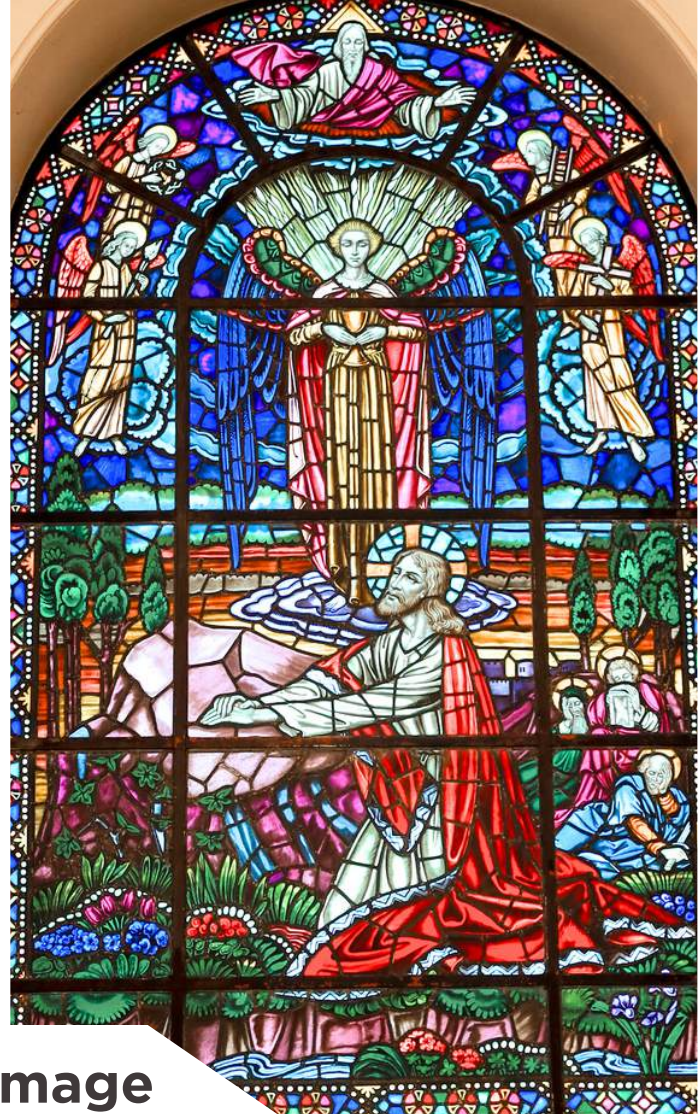
SPECIAL FOCUS OF JUBILEE YEAR 2025

Spiritual Renewal: The faithful are encouraged to grow in prayer, deepen their understanding of the faith, and participate in the sacraments regularly.

Reconciliation: Emphasis will be placed on the Sacrament of Reconciliation (confession) as a means of experiencing God's mercy and healing broken relationships.

Care for Creation: In line with Pope Francis' encyclical **Laudato Si'**, the Jubilee Year calls for greater stewardship of the environment. Pilgrims are invited to reflect on their responsibility to care for God's creation and take concrete actions to protect it.
