SAFEGUARDING WITHIN THE CHURCH

- **Prevention**: Setting up safe structures, policies and environments so abuse doesn't happen
- **Protection**: Acting immediately if someone is at risk or if concerns are raised.
- Pastoral Care: Supporting victims/survivors with compassion, counselling and respect

WHY IS IT **IMPORTANT?**

- Historical failures by some in the Church to protect people have deeply wounded individuals and communities
- Today, safeguarding is central to rebuilding trust, maintaining moral authority and living out Gospel values of love, justice and protection of the vulnerable.
- Is a vital part of the Church's mission of care and
- Accountability: Holding individuals, including clergy and laypeople, responsible for misconduct or failures
- responsibility.
- To ensure safe people are working and volunteering within our communities

SPECIFIC AREAS OF FOCUS

- 1. Training for clergy, volunteers and staff about safe practices and warning signs
- 2. Vetting processes like criminal background checks before someone can work with children or vulnerable adults
- 3. Clear reporting mechanisms: how to report concerns confidentially and safely.
- 4. Responding properly ensuring allegations are handled fairly, swiftly, and independently if needed.
- 5. Supporting healing offering care for those who have been hurt by abuse in the Church.
- 6. Monitoring individuals who may pose a risk (safeguarding plans).

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
